Mary B. Safrai works with hospice and palliative care patients and their families as an art therapist and Reiki Master through her private practice, Healing Arts Brought Home, and with the Visiting Nurse Service of New York Hospice and Palliative Care. Her article about art therapy in hospice appeared in Art Therapy: Journal of the American Art Therapy Association.

Mary has worked as an art therapist at Gay Men's Health Crisis, an agency for persons with HIV in New York, and with borderline personality disorder patients in a Dialectical Behavioral Therapy program at St. Vincent's Hospital. She serves on the steering committee of NYC Regional Arts in Healthcare, an organization dedicated to increasing dialogue between the expressive therapies and medical communities. In addition, she serves as the Treasurer of the New York Art Therapy Association.

Mary has presented on the importance of the creative arts in end-of-life care at the American Art Therapy Conference, the Expressive Therapies Summit, Jewish Theological Seminary in New York, and the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia University. She is passionate about increasing the availability of the creative arts in end-of-life care and building a community of creative arts therapists engaged in such work. Mary presents informally as often as possible to medical and home-care staffs about the benefits of the creative arts to patients, their caregivers, and their families.
