NOTE: This curriculum requires a total of 43-46 credits in the liberal arts. One course must fulfill a global studies requirement. (Courses that fulfill this category will be designated as global in the course description and course listings.) A student who has completed 4 years of the same foreign language in high school can choose to take just one, three-credit course above the 212 level to satisfy the foreign language requirement.

Academic Facts:

1. 120 credits are required for a degree.
2. Transfer students complete a minimum of 60 credits at Marywood divided equally between the major and the liberal arts.
3. All major courses should be taken at Marywood. Liberal arts courses may be taken at other colleges or universities and transferred with a grade of "C" or better.
4. Students must maintain a QPI average of 2.33 in their major and 2.0 overall to be retained and graduate.
