

SPEECH/LANGUAGE REFERRAL AND EVALUATION

Parents, professionals from other agencies, caregivers, guardians, physicians, teachers, or psychologists may contact the clinic to refer an individual for an evaluation of speech, language, and/or related areas. Initial contact will be made with the clinic director, who will speak with the individual, parent, or guardian to obtain the client's identifying information, and schedule the initial evaluation. Evaluations will vary in length based on the needs of the client.

SPEECH/LANGUAGE SERVICES

Individual and group therapy sessions for speech, language, and related disorders are provided. Other services include a child speech/language play group, social communication group, and an adult aphasia language group. If services are warranted following the evaluation, a schedule will be established. Individual therapy sessions are 45 minutes in length and start on the hour. Group sessions vary from 45 minutes to one hour in length. All services related to speech and language are provided by undergraduate and graduate student clinicians who work in conjunction with PA-licensed and ASHA-certified speech-language pathologists, who serve as clinical supervisors. Supervisors observe all sessions via closed circuit monitoring in real time. Parents/caregivers also have the opportunity to observe live sessions

Services include evaluations and treatment for both children and adults in the areas of:

- Accent Modification
- Aphasia
- Apraxia/Dyspraxia
- Articulation
- Augmentative and Alternative Communication
- Cognition
- Dysarthria
- Fluency
- Language
- Phonology
- Voice

AUDIOLOGY REFERRAL AND SERVICES

Initial contact for audiology services will be made with the audiologist who will obtain the client's identifying information, and schedule the initial appointment and any necessary follow up services.

Our PA-licensed and ASHA-certified audiologist schedules and completes basic diagnostic hearing evaluations and central auditory processing evaluations within our on-campus audiological suite. Hearing aid consultations, hearing aid fittings, hearing aid follow up, and hearing aid maintenance services are also provided. Assistive listening device consultations are also available.
