

7th Cunual Lead On Award Recipients

Marywood is proud to bestow **The Judge Richard P. and Marion Conaboy Family** with the **Lead On Award**, which recognizes their exemplary lifetime community leadership endeavors and the meaningful difference they have made through decades of public service, abiding faith, and dedication to the greater good of all. Like the mighty oak—a legendary symbol of wisdom, courage, wholesomeness, stability, and noble purpose—The Judge Richard P. and Marion Conaboy Family has flourished from the strong, deep roots of their original family tree and grown into an impressive forest of a grand extended

family. Established and led by the late Judge Richard P. and Marion Hartnett Conaboy, they have been nourished by unwavering faith, sturdy family bonds, and ongoing fidelity to the common good.

Richard and Marion, both born and raised in the Minooka section of Scranton, were educated in Scranton schools. He later graduated from the University of Scranton and joined the United States Army Air Forces, rising to the rank of sergeant before his honorable discharge in 1947, while she attended the Scranton Business School. Richard went on to Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America, from which he graduated in 1950. Later that same year, Richard married Marion, the love of his life, and the couple would raise a family of 12 children, eventually growing to include 48 grandchildren and 53 great-grandchildren.

This strong, cohesive family unit framed Richard's life as he earned many distinctive professional accomplishments that spanned multiple decades. He began his career in the private practice of law. He later became a judge on the Court of Common Pleas of Lackawanna County, including service as president judge. Ultimately, he was confirmed as a federal judge for the U.S. Middle District of Pennsylvania, where he also served as chief judge. Judge Conaboy led an effort to create standardized sentencing guidelines for judges across the Commonwealth, later serving as Chairman of the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing. In fact, his concern for ensuring that every citizen received equal treatment under the law was the hallmark of his judicial philosophy—an enduring legacy of fairness and justice. Marion excelled on the home front as a wife and mother extraordinaire—no small feat for a mother of 12. She entertained, healed broken hearts, comforted the disappointed, celebrated good news, and nourished those she loved, accompanying all things with a delicious meal. Her community involvement included service on behalf of the March of Dimes, United Way, United Nations Day, Lackawanna Bar Auxiliary, United Neighborhood Center, Scranton Prep Board of Trustees, Prep Mothers' Club, the Young Democrats, and teaching CCD, in addition to supporting her husband's judicial campaigns. In all things, she loved others fiercely and with great compassion.

Together, the Conaboys tenderly upheld one another throughout 68 devoted years of marriage, and their lasting impact reached well beyond the bench and the family home, making a significant difference in the greater community. They generously supported and provided leadership for the cause of education, healthcare institutions, and civic organizations serving those in need. They were lifelong, faithful members of the Catholic Church—first at St. Francis of Assisi Church and then at St. Paul of the Cross Parish at Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary Church in South Scranton.

Judge Conaboy once commented to a young law clerk, "Having 12 children of your own prepares you like nothing else to be a judge. You learn patience. You learn respect for opposing points of view. You learn tolerance. Parenthood is great training for the bench." If parenting is great training for the bench, then having a dad like Richard and a mom like Marion perfectly prepared each one of their 12 children to become socially responsible adults who live fulfilling, purpose-driven lives of their choosing. Several are Marywood graduates. Through their respective vocations as healthcare professionals, attorneys, devoted spouses, and loving parents, they all serve as community leaders, each in their own right, changing lives locally and globally, from Scranton to Haiti, as they continue their parents' tradition of joyful, loving service.

Please join the entire Marywood community in honoring the legacy of **The Judge Richard P. and Marion Conaboy Family,** who we recognize with our deepest gratitude for their lifelong commitment of love, faithfulness, service, and friendship to one another, to Marywood, and to the greater community, through their exemplary leadership and devoted efforts to create a more just, compassionate world.
